Complete Cast and Creative Team Announced for San Diego REP's production of Anna Ziegler's ACTUALLY

San Diego, CA (September 14, 2018) – San Diego Repertory Theatre announced today that DeLeon Dallas (REP's *Honky*) and Emily Shain will star in its upcoming production of *Actually* by the award-winning playwright, Anna Ziegler. Jesca Prudencio (REP's *Vietgone*) will direct the production, which runs October 11 – November 4, 2018, in the Lyceum Space Theatre. Tickets start at \$25 and are on sale to the general public. Previews run October 11 – 16. Opening night is Wednesday, October 17 at 7:00 p.m.

At a raucous party during their freshman year at Princeton, Tom and Amber connect in ways that seem innocent enough at first. They flirt, they get drunk, and they hook up. The next day Amber accuses Tom of rape, and the two find themselves in murky territory with ramifications that could affect the rest of their lives. What actually happened between them? Tackling the highly-charged topic of sexual consent, this intimate and surprising drama explores the intersection of gender and race on college campuses today. When it comes to sex, what is consent and when can it be given? If you don't remember giving it, does sex become assault?

Deeply-felt, funny and extraordinarily provocative, fast-rising playwright Anna Ziegler's play is an intricate and psychologically complex jigsaw puzzle. Crafted with compassion and profound insight, *Actually* leaves it to the audience to grapple with the gray area of truth, where there are three sides to every story.

"I am thrilled to be returning to San Diego REP to direct this complex play exploring the humanity behind both sides of the timely and painfully relevant issue of consent," shared Director **Jesca Prudencio**. "Actually allows two compelling characters to speak their truth, confiding in our audience through this nonstop action-packed emotional rollercoaster. As the playwright, Anna Ziegler said so eloquently, 'the more you get to know someone, the harder it is to judge."

The two-hander cast includes San Diego based actor **DeLeon Dallas** as Tom, who was last seen at The REP in *Honky*, which was broadcast nationally as a part of the KPBS series, *OnStage in America*. Starring alongside Dallas is New York-based actor **Emily Shain** as Amber. Shain's credits include *Indecent* at La Jolla Playhouse and *What May Fall* at the Guthrie Theatre. Dallas and Shain are both graduates of the prestigious MFA in Acting program at University of California, San Diego.

Anna Ziegler (Playwright): Anna Ziegler has written the plays *Actually* (Manhattan Theatre Club; Williamstown Theatre Festival; Geffen Playhouse; L.A. Ovation Award winner for Playwriting for an Original Play), the widely produced *Photograph 51* (directed on the West End by Michael Grandage and starring Nicole Kidman; WhatsOnStage Award for Best New Play), *Boy* (Keen Company/Ensemble Studio Theatre; TimeLine Theatre; Outer Critics Circle John Gassner Award nominee), *The Wanderers* (The Old Globe; winner of The Blanche and Irving Laurie Theatre Visions Fund), *The Last Match* (Roundabout Theatre Company; The Old Globe; City Theatre; Craig Noel Award nominee for Outstanding New Play), and *A Delicate Ship* (New York Times Critic's Pick; The Playwrights Realm; Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park). She currently holds commissions from Roundabout Theatre Company, Second Stage Theatre, Seattle Repertory Theatre, and The Geffen Playhouse. Her plays have been developed at The Sundance Theatre Lab, The O'Neill Theater Center's National Playwrights Conference, Cape Cod Theatre Project, New York Stage and Film, Old Vic New Voices, and Soho Rep.'s Writer/Director Lab, among others. Her plays are published by Dramatists Play Service; a collection entitled *Anna Ziegler: Plays One* is published by Oberon Books. She is currently developing a television show for HBO and a screenplay for Scott Free Productions.

Jesca Prudencio (Director): is a theater director focused on creating highly physical productions of new plays, musicals, and documentary theater. Favorite credits include Qui Nguyen's *Vietgone* (San Diego Rep), Will Snider's *How To Use a Knife* (Mixed Blood), David Henry Hwang's *Bondage* (Drama League's Directorfest), *Calling: a Dance with Faith* (Ping Chong & Company, NYC), Ben Fisher's *Mobile Happiness Bazaar* (La Jolla Playhouse's WoW Festival), and *FAN: stories from the brothels of Bangkok* (Thailand). Assistant directing credits include Ping Chong's *Throne of Blood* at BAM and Oregon Shakespeare Festival, Disney's *The Hunchback of Notre Dame* at La Jolla Playhouse, and *Plenty* at The Public Theater. She holds a BFA from NYU Tisch, and an MFA in Directing from UC San Diego. She is a recipient of The Drama League Fall Fellowship, The Old Vic's US/UK Exchange, and the inaugural Julie Taymor World Theater Fellowship, which supported her travels through Thailand, Japan, and The Philippines in 2017. She is founder and Artistic Director of People Of Interest, which creates new theatrical events that address community-specific issues. Jesca is currently Head of Directing at San Diego State University. Upcoming projects: *Man of God* at East West Players in L.A.
