SAN DIEGO REPERTORY THEATRE ANNOUNCES THE CAST & CREATIVE TEAM FOR THE PULITZER PRIZE-WINNING PRODUCTION OF SWEAT

SAN DIEGO, CA – **March 5, 2019 - San Diego Repertory Theatre** (San Diego REP) announced today the cast and creative team for **Lynn Nottage's** *Sweat*, winner of the 2017 Pulitzer Prize for Best Play. Directed by REP artistic director **Sam Woodhouse**, *Sweat* will be the final show in The REP's 43rd season. *Sweat* will run **April 18 – May 12, 2019**, at San Diego REP's Lyceum Stage Theatre, with previews April 18 - 23, and press opening on **Wednesday**, **April 24 at 7:00 p.m**.

With humor and tremendous heart, this Pulitzer Prize-winning drama speaks directly to the unsettling changes in America. The setting is the steel town of Reading, Pennsylvania, one of the poorest communities in America. A group of close friends share everything: drinks, secrets and laughs. When rumors of layoffs shake up the factory where they work, the fragile bonds of their community begin to splinter and a horrific crime sends shockwaves across two generations. The neighborhood bar turns into a battleground where race, class, family and friendship clash.

Nottage went to Reading during the Great Recession to understand first-hand the impact of our country's economic decline. She perfectly captures the true stories of what happened to the American working-class who feel betrayed by the false promises of the American dream. Their struggle to reclaim what's lost, find redemption and redefine themselves in the 21st century are at the heart of Time Magazine's #1 Play of 2017.

Hailed by The New York Times as "Extraordinarily moving and surprisingly funny," and "Masterful, passionate and necessary" by Time Out New York, *Sweat* is a compelling portrait of pride and survival in the rust belt. *Sweat* marks the second Nottage play to be produced at The REP, following *Intimate Apparel* in 2006. An acclaimed writer, Nottage is the first and only female in history to win two Pulitzer Prizes for Drama; the first for *Ruined* in 2009, and *Sweat* in 2017.

"Sweat is one of my favorite kinds of theatre – a hyper, authentic story based on interviews with real people telling the intimate truths about their real tragedies and dreams," shared REP artistic director Sam Woodhouse. "The 'American dream' is one that I grew up with, believing that if I worked hard my future was without limits. To encounter a true story about the loss of that dream is a profound emotional experience."

win two Pulitzer Prizes for drama. Her plays have been produced widely in the United States and throughout the world. Sweat (Pulitzer Prize, Obie Award, Susan Smith Blackburn Prize, Tony Nomination, Drama Desk Nomination) moved to Broadway after a sold out run at The Public Theater. It premiered and was commissioned by Oregon Shakespeare Festival American Revolutions History Cycle/Arena Stage, By The Way, Meet Vera Stark (Lilly Award, Drama Desk Nomination), Ruined (Pulitzer Prize, OBIE, Lucille Lortel, New York Drama Critics' Circle, Audelco, Drama Desk, and Outer Critics Circle Award), Intimate Apparel (American Theatre Critics and New York Drama Critics' Circle Awards for Best Play), Fabulation, or The Re-Education of Undine (OBIE Award), Crumbs from the Table of Joy, Las Meninas, Mud, River, Stone, Por'knockers and POOF!. In addition, she is working with composer Ricky Ian Gordon on adapting her play Intimate Apparel into an opera (commissioned by The Met/LCT). She is also developing This is Reading, a performance installation based on two years of interviews set to open at the Franklin Street, Reading Railroad Station in Reading, PA in July. She is currently an artist-in-residence at the Park Avenue Armory. She is the cofounder of the production company, Market Road Films, whose most recent projects include *The Notorious Mr.* Bout directed by Tony Gerber and Maxim Pozdorovkin (Premiere/Sundance 2014), First to Fall directed by Rachel Beth Anderson (Premiere/ IDFA, 2013) and Remote Control (Premiere/Busan 2013- New Currents Award) Over the years, she has developed original projects for HBO, Sidney Kimmel Entertainment, Showtime, This is That and Harpo. She is writer/producer on the Netflix series She's Gotta Have It directed by Spike Lee. Nottage is the recipient of a MacArthur "Genius Grant" Fellowship, Steinberg "Mimi" Distinguished Playwright Award, PEN/Laura Pels Master Playwright Award, Merit and Literature Award from The Academy of Arts and Letters, Columbia University Provost Grant, Doris Duke Artist Award, The Joyce Foundation Commission Project & Grant, Madge Evans-Sidney Kingsley Award, Nelson A. Rockefeller Award for Creativity, The Dramatists Guild Hull-Warriner Award, the inaugural Horton Foote Prize, Helen Hayes Award, the Lee Reynolds Award, and the Jewish World Watch iWitness Award. Her other honors include the National Black Theatre Fest's August Wilson Playwriting Award, a Guggenheim Grant, Lucille Lortel Fellowship and Visiting Research Fellowship at Princeton University. She is a graduate of Brown University and the Yale School of Drama. She is also an Associate Professor in the Theatre Department at Columbia School of the Arts. Nottage is a board member for BRIC Arts Media Bklyn, Donor Direct Action, Dramatist Play Service, Second Stage and the Dramatists Guild. She recently completed a three-year term as an Artist Trustee on the Board of the Sundance Institute. She is member of The Dramatists Guild and WGAE.

LYNN NOTTAGE (PLAYWRIGHT): Lynn is a playwright and a screenwriter, and the first woman in history to

SAM WOODHOUSE (Director): Co-founded San Diego REP with D.W. Jacobs in 1976, and has since worked as a director, producer or actor on more than 280 productions. As an actor, he has performed on The REP stages in *The Seafarer*, in the title role of *King Lear, Proof, Hamlet*, and with the San Diego Symphony Orchestra in the title role of Stravinsky's *L'Histoire du Soldat*.
