### SAN DIEGO REPERTORY THEATRE ANNOUNCES ITS 2021/2022 SEASON

A super-sized season of offerings including the world-famous comedy troupe The Second City, a Tony and Olivier Award winning play, 3 exciting new plays by incredible and diverse writers, a Herbert Siguenza world premiere, and a musical adaptation of one of Shakespeare's best stories.

San Diego, CA (July 27, 2021) – San Diego Repertory Theatre (San Diego REP) announced today the lineup for its 2021/2022 season and return to in-person performance at the Lyceum Theatre. For its super-sized 46th season, San Diego REP invites audiences to go on a trip that flips *The Grapes of Wrath* on its head as the Joads head back to Oklahoma in *Mother Road*; to laugh their heads off with *She the People* by The Second City; to dive deep into the mystery and adventure of the 2015 Tony Award-winner for Best Play, *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time*; to take a journey of self-discovery, with a hilarious surprise visitor in *The Great Khan*; to spend Passover with the Levi-Katz family in the JFest favorite *In Every Generation*; to dance the night away and find true love with a musical adaptation of *Twelfth Night*; to head for the stars on a hilarious intergalactic adventure penned by Playwright-in-Residence Herbert Siguenza, *Isaac Asimov Grandmaster Funk*; and to finish the season with one of the biggest and best offerings San Diego REP has brought to the stage in its 46 year history, to be announced later. "There is nothing like the transformative experience of sharing an unforgettable story in a room with your neighbors, live and in person. Our family of first class theatre artists is thrilled to welcome our patrons back into the Lyceum theatre with our arms and hearts wide open."

"Our new 21-22 season offers a majestic sweep of eight entertainments that seek to uplift us through the healing power of laughter and empathy. We can't wait to share it with you," said **REP Managing Director Larry Alldredge**. "Our commitment to honestly and bravely exploring our ever-evolving American culture is stronger than ever. Artistic virtuosity and diversity is once again ready to rumble on the stages of the Lyceum theatre."

Inspired by John Steinbeck's masterpiece *The Grapes of Wrath*, *Mother Road* (October 7 – 31, 2021) by **Octavio Solis**, directed by Woodhouse, opens the season and flips a literary classic on its

head. This imagined sequel to one of the greatest American novels ever sees the Joads return to Oklahoma and reckon with what it means to be American in the 21<sup>st</sup>-century Western United States.

The second offering of the season is the high octane, fearlessly funny, *She the People* (November 17 – December 5, 2021), with the world famous comedy company *The Second City* setting up shop in The Lyceum in November and December. With rave reviews in Chicago, DC and Toronto, this hilarious comedy showcase directed by *Carly Heffernan* satirizes the reality of being a woman in this wild world, exploding the myths and misrepresentations surrounding bachelorettes, Beyoncé, the 2020 election and much more. *The Washington Post* called it a "funny, fiercely political sketch-comedy show" and the *Chicago Tribune* called it "empowering entertainment."

**REP Associate Artistic Director Todd Salovey** will direct the 2015 Tony Award-winner for Best Play, *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time* (January 6 – 30, 2022). This widely beloved play is the winner of 7 Olivier Awards and 5 Tony Awards, and has consistently been one of the most-produced plays every season since its premiere.

Fresh from a well-received reading in San Diego REP's Black Voices 2021 Play Reading Series, *The Great Khan* (March 3 – 27, 2022) by **Michael Gene Sullivan** is getting a full production in the theatre's 46<sup>th</sup> season. A hilarious, moving, and deeply profound story about claiming your identity and telling your story might just have a few surprises in store for REP audiences. Sullivan, hailed as a voice in American theatre that audiences need to know, brings his story to The REP in March of next year.

One of the annual Lipinsky Family San Diego Jewish Arts Festival's most well-loved readings in recent history, *In Every Generation* (May 26 – June 19, 2022) by **Ali Viterbi** tells the story of one family's Passover celebration; in this case, one family over many millennia. Join the Levi-Katz family as they share stories, eat (vegan) brisket and matzah ball soup, and grapple with questions of the past.

Named one of the best theatrical productions of 2018 by *Time*, *The Hollywood Reporter*, and the *Washington Post*, *Twelfth Night* (July 28 – August 21, 2022) will have audiences dancing in the aisles and finding love in the mysterious land of Illyria. Conceived by **Kwame Kwei-Armah** and **Shaina Taub**, with infectious music and lyrics by Taub, this musical adaptation of Shakespeare's timeless classic about mistaken identity and true love is certain to be one of the highlights of the year. Presented in partnership with San Diego School of Creative and Performing Arts, Artistic Director Sam Woodhouse directs, with choreography by San Diego legend **Javier Velasco**.

San Diego audiences love the wildly entertaining writing of Herbert Siguenza. His latest play *Isaac Asimov Grandmaster Funk* (September 8 – October 2, 2022) is a sci-fi fantasy told in the key of funk. Acclaimed director **Thomas W. Jones II** brings his audacious imagination to the staging of this intergalactic comedy that features Siguenza in the role of the king of 20<sup>th</sup> century science fiction.

The theatre's eighth and final subscription show of the 2021-22 season (October 20 – November 13, 2022) will be an absolute showstopper! Directed by Artistic Director Sam Woodhouse, this final offering of the season is shaping up to be one of the most exciting presentations by The REP in 46 years of bringing intimate, provocative, inclusive theatre to San Diego.
